With the influx of additional people seeking asylum, makeshift settlements have expanded and the needs

of the displaced population have changed.

To date, only 33,000 out of 626,000 refugees have been granted official refugee status in Bangladesh. In terms of protection, a key question is the lack of identification. UNHCR's biometric registration is underway, but given the magnitude of the influx, it will likely take time for all families wishing to register to do so.

The risks of communicable diseases remain high because of living conditions, inadequate water and sanitation facilities (WASH) and low vaccination coverage. Weak referral pathway mechanism is also a challenge.

Since mid-September MDM has launched a program in Cox's Bazar district, Bangladesh, in order to improve access to quality health care for displaced population with our local partners Gonoshasthaya Kendra (GK) and Bangladesh National Women Lawyers Association (BNWLA).

Activities of primary health care including nutrition, curative consultations, referrals as well as training to the national staff are implemented.

MdM has also launched the construction of three new PHC clinics where GBV consultation and mental health and psychosocial support activities will be set-up.

Supporting GBV survivors in crisis contexts





GBV response at Médecins du Monde is part of a comprehensive approach which aims to support resilience of people. MdM's commitment to sexual and reproductive rights also extends to crisis situations through the implementation of the Minimum Emergency Mechanism from the first steps of the response.

The 17th IAWG Annual Meeting in Athens from 8 to 10 November, was an opportunity for MdM to discuss lessons learned on GBV in Central African Republic. MdM has, indeed, developed an innovative approach to deal with gender-based violence survivors, enabling them to have access to medical care, psychosocial support and legal aid within 6 health centers in Bangui.

The event brought together people dedicated to improving the quality, access and use of sexual and reproductive health services in humanitarian settings.

The Central African case study was also presented on November, 23rd during a meeting organized by the **Chanel** Foundation in Paris on the theme of resilience of migrant and refugee women.

As part of a 4-day training in Amman led by Aurélie Leroyer, Desk Officer and Chloé Roger, Medical Advisor at the Emergency Department, **GBV guidance notes newly translated into Arabic were presented and distributed to the team.**
