- Evènement international
- 1^{ère} édition le 13 novembre 2018: célébration du centenaire de l'armistice
- Rassemble des acteurs de la gouvernance mondiale: chefs d'État et de gouvernement, représentants nationaux et locaux, représentants d'organisations internationales et acteurs de la société civile
- Six thématiques majeures dont « Développement »/Intérêt d'une approche multilatérale: santé publique, développement, droits de l'Homme, justice sociale
- Objectif annoncé: promouvoir des projets apportant des solutions concrètes
- Modalités:
 - Présentation de 100 projets via des stands
 - Débats entre dirigeants, élus, experts, etc.

THE WAR ON DRUGS HAS FAILED

HINDERING DEVELOPMENT
 Corrupt policies and policies affect the achievement of the SDGs, especially those concerning poverty, health, gender, peace and justice.

UNDERMINING HUMAN RIGHTS
 Harsh policies have resulted in wide-ranging human rights violations, including thousands of executions, extra-judicial killings,

ENDANGERING HEALTH
 Over 100,000 people were killed every year by drug-related deaths every minute as a result of punitive drug policies.

ERODING GOOD GOVERNANCE
 Drug policies perpetuate cycles of exclusion, socioeconomic marginalisation and weaken the outcomes.

WEAKENING COMMUNITIES
 Drug policies perpetuate cycles of exclusion, socioeconomic marginalisation and weaken the outcomes.

BUILDING CAPACITY TO EMPOWER COMMUNITIES
FOSTERING A LEARNING COMMUNITY
 Since 2013, the campaign has sought to strengthen communities, engage in dialogue with policymakers and influence narratives in the media and public opinion.
 Encouraging continued engagement and more ambitious work plans for greater impact.
 Offering trainings and support to strengthen campaigning and advocacy among local partners.

TRANSNATIONAL NETWORKED CHANGE
ACROSS BORDERS, TOGETHER
 Hosted by the International Drug Policy Consortium, the campaign encourages local ownership of messages and actions.
 Every 26 June, the campaign holds a Global Day of Action. In 2019, thousands mobilised in 261 cities of 62 countries.
 Online communication tools, including a database with 1000+ actions worldwide, promote global exchanges and learning.

 - Plan antistupéfiants et création de l'OFASST
- Une avancée positive: validation d'une expérimentation du cannabis thérapeutique
- Difficulté à mobiliser les élus et responsables français pour venir au Forum (événement pas encore identifié dans leur agenda politique)
- Réunion close à l'Assemblée Nationale avec la Commission Globale en matière de politique des drogues

- Cinquantenaire de la loi de 70 instaurant la répression du trafic et de l'usage de stupéfiants
- Stratégie de plaidoyer interassociatif: Collectif pour une Nouvelle Politique des Drogues
- Lancement d'une mission d'information parlementaire sur les usages de cannabis
- Recherche socio-anthropologique en cours sur l'impact de la criminalisation en Franc
