KEY FIGURES



Since **June 2022**, a 30-years record-breaking monsoon has led to severe floods affecting **over 80% of Pakistan**.



33 millions people affected including **7.6 million estimated people displaced**



6.4 million people are in need of Humanitarian Assistance



2 million houses are fully or partially damaged



1 million live stock of the country have been affected

KEY INFORMATIONS



A 30-years record-breaking monsoon combined with glacial lake outburst flood events has led to severe floods in Pakistan since August 2022, affecting over **80% of the country and 33 million people**. All provinces are affected with floods, even changing the country's topography with the creation of new lakes in some areas. In total, **1,638 people were killed and 12,865 people were injured**. As of now, **7.6 million estimated people are displaced, 2,049,482 houses** are fully or partially damaged, in addition **1 million live stock** of the country have died because of the floods. **12,700 km of roads** were damaged, and more than 375 bridges were partially damaged or destroyed. The Pakistani government has declared 81 districts across Balochistan (32), Sindh (23) and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (17), GB (6), and Punjab (3) as calamity hit.

National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) reported massive loss across **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province**, where MdM was already active: **306 people were killed** (including 116 children, 41 women and 149 men) and **369 were injured** (including 134 children, 79 women and 156 men). Over **91,463 houses** were fully destroyed or partially damaged and about **21,328 livestock** have perished because of the floods. Charsadda, Nowshera, DI Khan, Tank, and Swat districts are the worst affected districts of KP province.



HEALTH SITUATION

The floods has severely affected the health sector of Pakistan. Over **1,400 public health facilities including 208 in KP**, are reported as partially or fully destroyed. Medicine, medical equipment and vaccines are washed-away with the flood. The replenishment of supplies remains challenging amidst the wide-spread damage to roads and bridges. Moreover, the **outbreak of malaria, dengue, acute watery diarrhea, and cholera** are being reported and expected massive rise in the coming days. In fact, in KP province, **over 5,000 patients** have been identified within 24 hours with communicable diseases such as diarrhea, AWD, ARI, Skin Infections, Eye Infections, Pneumonia and Typhoid in the most affected districts (DI Khan, Swat, Charsadda, Nowshera and Tank). Similar diseases are reported at MdM clinics.

Moreover, while water is receding, people are going back home which is doubling the pressure of public health facilities which survived the floods.

MDM RESPONSE

MdM organized the reponse from August 28th, through integrated outreach healthcare and reproductive health services with MISP mobile clinics in KP province, in Nowshera, Charsadda and Chitral districts with:

- * **Primary health care consultations** including ante-natal and pre-natal consultations,
- * **Sexual and Reproductive consultations** for adolescent girls and women,
- * Children and diseases **screening, awareness sessions** and education.
- * Residential tents have been installed accommodating more than 52,000 people.
- * New assessment is ongoing for other affected parts of the province (Dera Ismail Khan district – DI Khan).
- * MdM has **donated medicines and equipment** to 2 Government health facilities including one teaching hospital in KP.

MdM is in close coordination with district health department, and other stakeholders to ensure coordinated efforts and avoidance of duplication.



