



# IMPACT OF THE EARTHQUAKES ON TÜRKİYE

9.1M affected people

2.5M children in need of humanitarian assistance 5.2M targeted for humanitarian assistance people forced to relocate from their homes

1.6M
people staying in informal settlements

50K people killed

- Over 25,000 aftershocks
- 164.321 buildings (327 contractors arrested)
- Damage = 9% of Türkiye's gross national income

## HATAY Post-Earthquake Response

24.000 people died only in Hatay in 65 seconds.

# IMPACT OF THE EARTHQUAKES ON HATAY

- 1.6 million Turks + 360K Syrians affected in Hatay
- Turned into "hell" & "ghost city" (after S&R), Container city
- Death toll = other 9 provinces affected by the quakes
- %51 collapsed + heavily damaged
- No electricity 

  Security threats: looting, robbery etc.
- No heating/shower/toilet
- Rural villages & refugee camps became overpopulated
- Lack of health facilities / health staff
- Multicultural demography affected
- Industrial capacity decreased by 79%, caused job losses

# IMPACT OF THE EARTHQUAKES ON MEDECINS DU MONDE TÜRKİYE

- Lost 4 staff (DNA test)
- All Hatay staff mentally and physically affected
- Antakya Base Office and vehicles damaged







### CHANGES IN THE CONTEXT

- √ 16 Public Hospitals are functional with 60% capacity
- ✓ 96 PHCCs active with 50% capacity but still not enough # of doctors.
- ✓ 8 MHCs (out of 26) are <u>active (30%)</u>
- ✓ 216 Container camps constructed, 58 opened
- ✓ Tent areas (mostly refugees) not completely removed (winter has come!)
- ✓ Refugees are being transferred to 1 container camp of 30K capacity
- ✓ Asbestos is a long-term public health threat
- ✓ Public health risks caused by limited access to Safe Water
- ✓ Public transportation is very limited
- ✓ Still not enough job opportunities; agriculture sector is functional

### CHANGES IN THE NEEDS

#### PHC

- Scabies,
- Need for <u>Mobile services to the rural areas</u> continue
- Elderly, disabled, chronic diseases have limited access
- Medication and Physician <u>may not be allowed the latest after March</u> 2024

## **Emerging Public Health risks related to WASH services Need analysis completed**

- Access to Safe / Drinking Water
  - Distribution of personal Water Filters
  - Provision of safe water through Mobile Water Tanks
- Regular Water Quality Testing
- Need for Hygiene and Sanitation Kits
- Lack of awareness on hygiene
- Lack of Advocacy before the authorities and donor organizations


#### REDESIGNED SERVICE MODEL


### Médecins du Monde Türkiye's Transition Plan

#### HEALTHCARE SERVICE GAP IN JANDAIRIS

- •No hospitals, population 500,000.
- Long-term need advocated by health authorities.
- •No X-Ray center
- No Emergency services.
- Min 30-minute drive to Afrin city.
- •Patients are often **referred to hospitals in Hatay-Turkey** for specialized care due to the gap in services in Afrin.

#### **ROLE OF THE JANDAIRIS SURGERY HOSPITAL**

- Improve access to appropriate surgical care and intensive medical care
- •Respond to **any other unforeseen emergency** or health issue that may arise in NWS.
- •Will reduce cross-border patient referrals from Afrin to Hatay.
